Mind maps and Mood boards can be created as digital or physical documents

digital – produced on a computer

physical – produced by hand


Physical mind maps can be created:

- on paper or in a book
- using flipcharts
- on a white board

Physical mood boards can be created:

- in a book
- on paper
- on a board
- on a wall

Physical versions:






Physical moodboards can include fabric, textures, post it notes etc... as well as cut out images, hand drawn sketches and so on

To create **digital** mind maps and mood boards, you need:

- software
- hardware

Digital versions:





Digital documents can include video, audio, animation, hyperlinks etc...

Digital documents can include things that physical ones can't:

- audio
- video
- animation
- hyperlinks

Hardware – the computer **equipment** needed to produce a digital pre-prod document:

- monitor (screen)
- mouse, keyboard, trackpad etc...
- graphics tablet (for drawing)
- touch screen (for drawing)
- scanner
- digital camera (must say digital just camera is wrong)
- microphone

NOT headphones, printer, TV

Be careful about writing "computer", "laptop", "tablet", "phone" etc...

Sometimes the exam board has allowed this, sometimes they haven't

Software – the computer **programs** needed to produce a digital pre-prod document

- word processor
- presentation software
- image editing software
- online tool or app (collaborative)

"Collaborative" means that people can work together on the same document, all adding ideas

project management software – for a work plan

General terms like these are better than the names of programs and are more likely to be marked right

So "presentation software" is a better answer than "PowerPoint"

A **physical** version can be produced using:

- pens/pencils
- paper
- photographs/images/sketches
- textiles (moodboard)
- models (vis diag/moodboard)

Physical versions can be **converted** to digital using:

- scanner
- digital camera
