## Camera shots – type of shot

Camera shots allow the focus of a panel to help tell the story



Long/wide shots are often used to show where the action is taking place at the start of a scene.

These give the audience an idea of the context of the scene and are called **Key shots** or **Establishing shots** 

## Camera shots used include:

- Close up a close up view, often of a face. Often used to show an expression
- Long shot/wide shot a view from a long distance away.
  Shows the wider scene
- Mid shot somewhere between the two – it might show a person from the waist up or inside a vehicle. Used for most panels
