Part One: What are Storyboards?

1. Describe, in 25 words or less, what the job of a storyboard is. [2 marks]
2. At what stage in the production process will a storyboard be produced? [1 mark]
3. List **five** types of product that a storyboard could be needed for. [5 marks]
4. Identify **six** things that might be included on a storyboard other than sketches [6 marks]
5. Identify **three** purposes of storyboards (why are they used?) [1 mark]
6. Identify **three** groups of people who are the audience for a storyboard [3 marks]

Hint: the answer is not the target audience for the product. They will never see the storyboard. You need to be thinking about the people who will use the storyboard itself.
7. Why do storyboards use sketches to show the scene content? [2 marks]
8. Explain why directors working in the film industry would always use a storyboard [4 marks]

Part Two: Producing Storyboards

9. Identify **two** types of software you could use to produce a storyboard [2 marks]

Hint: be careful here – Office software will be marked wrong.
10. Identify **three** pieces of hardware you could use to produce a storyboard [3 marks]

Hint: hardware is something attached to a computer that you can touch
11. Storyboards are often produced by hand, using pencil and paper. Describe **two** ways you could convert a physical storyboard into a digital version [2 marks]
