
Wireframe Layouts are a pre-production document

They are created during the **planning stage** of a product's development

They are **diagrams** which plan the **layout** used for the pages of a **multi-page product** such as website or interactive multimedia project



Wireframe layouts will be created by **web designers** or graphic designers to show basic layouts

These ideas might be checked with the **client**


They will then be used by web developers and graphic artists to create the final product

Purposes:


- plan the **basic layout** used on pages of a multi-page product
- help ensure consistency across all the pages of a product
- identify what assets will be needed across multiple pages
 e.g. logos, videos, navigation buttons etc...
- allow the creation of templates or master pages to speed up the creation of the final product

Wireframe layouts are basic designs – they do not include detailed sketches



- boxes to show layout with white space between
- lines to show text
- boxes with crosses to represent images
- annotations to explain how elements link together, explain design decisions, and show a user's journey
- dimensions
- ideas for colours, fonts etc...

- word processing software
- presentation software
- desktop publishing software
- graphics software
- specialist flowchart software or web apps such as <u>Figma</u> or <u>MockFlow</u>
- collaborative online tools (such as Google Docs) can work well to create this sort of product in a team

Hardware:


- mouse, keyboard, monitor, trackpad, touch screen
- graphics tablet


Physical wireframes:

- paper/book/pen
- flipchart
- whiteboard

These could be turned into a digital version with a digital camera or scanner
