



The **creator's name** is in the box at the top. That's important to write down if you can. On the right it says "**You just attribute the author**" in the green box

Flaticon copyright status

You'd do this like shown here:

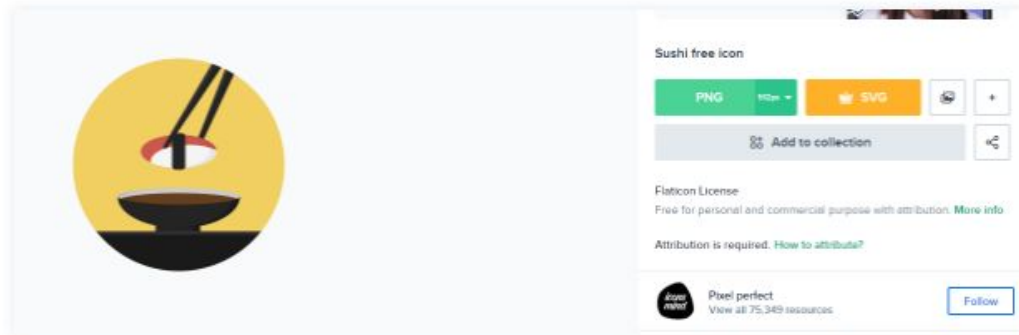
Attribution: How, when and where?

If you are a Free user you must always attribute the author when using our resources, below you can see the structure of the correct attribution line.

Let's see some examples:

In this link, you can see on the right side of the icon the name Pixel perfect:

http://www.flaticon.com/free-icon/sushi_187463#term=sushi&page=1&position=68



Therefore, the attribution line should be:

"Icon made by Pixel perfect from www.flaticon.com"



So in my example, I'd go "Microphone icon made by Kiranshastry from www.flaticon.com"

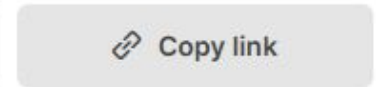
It also says the name of the person to attribute on the screen that pops up after you download the image. Next to the adorable dinosaur...



Hey! Remember you have to attribute Kiranshastry.

Every time you attribute t-rex can drink his coffee

Flaticon copyright status

When would you do this?

Websites:

Insert the attribution on the page where the icon is shown. This can be placed next to the image or on the footer of the website.

Printed products:

Paste this attribution on the final work so the authorship is known (for instance, in the acknowledgements chapter of a book).

Apps/games:

Place the attribution on the app's credits page **and** on the description page on the app store.

Social Networks:

Insert the attribution line "Icon made by [author link] from @flaticon" (E.g.: Icon made by Freepik from @flaticon) on the post or post comments.

Stickers:

It would be great if you could add the attribution line "Sticker made by Flaticon" where you use it, but we understand that it's complicated to add this line in a chat, and therefore it's not mandatory to add the attribution line if you use our stickers in a chat.

For an IDMP I think there'd be a credits page somewhere on a commercial version

So the attribution would probably go there

You don't need to actually do this. You cover it in your assets table

PNG image properties

Finding the resolution (dpi/ppi) of a PNG can be tricky

1. Open **PhotoPaint**
2. Open the image (**File > Open**)
3. Go **File > Document Properties** (at the bottom)

You'll find the resolution here

4. **Close** the file without saving it
