


Working with shapes – gradient fill

1. **Select** the shape that you want to fill.


At the top, click Window > Gradient

2. First, make sure the **Fill box** is on top. If it isn't, clicking it will bring it to the top



3. Use the **drop down** next to the coloured box to choose a **White, Black gradient**

This will remove any colour from your shape. That's OK




Double click on the **left slider** on the gradient bar and set it to the colour you want to be the basis for the fill




TIP: use the **swatches box** to make it easier to set the colour


4. **Double click** on the **right slider** and choose the same colour
This looks like it's just created a one colour shape. That's OK



5. While you're clicked on one of the sliders, change the **opacity** to **10%**. This will create the gradient fill



6. Change the **angle** to **45 degrees**. You can experiment with different angles to see what effect it has on the fill



7. You can try setting the colours differently: try going from a dark shade of a colour to a lighter shade and see what that does.
8. Add lettering and then **export** your work (**File > Export** – use **PNG file**)
