What is GCHQ?

- GCHQ is the UK's intelligence, security and cyber agency. It was set up in 1919
- Its mission is to help keep the country safe
- During World War II it helped to decipher enemy codes which helped Britain and its allies win the war
- Today it still deals with codes, but is also important in keeping the country's computer systems secure



GCHQ stands for **Government Communications Headquarters**

It employs over 6000 people and is based at Cheltenham in a building known as the Doughnut
