## **Advanced Audacity Editing**

To fade volume in and out use this cool method:

- 1. Click the **Envelope Tool** button
- 2. **Drag** the audio in your track down to reduce the whole track volume a bit
- 3. Now start to **drag audio up and down** as required (it takes some getting used to keep experimenting!). You'll see small markers added to the track edge these are the bits you've dragged.


## Simple ways to change track volume:


These are simpler and not as controllable but will still work

- 1. Use the Track Volume control
- Highlight a section of a track (using the selection tool) > <u>Effects</u> > <u>Amplify</u>.
  Choose a <u>negative amplification</u> to reduce volume (you may need to tick the allow clipping box)

This method would allow you to fade volume out for a section of a soundtrack where you want some vocal track over the top of the background audio.







Other useful quick effects include Fade In and Fade Out. Highlight a selection and the volume comes in from zero (or fades out to zero)
