
Working with shapes – transparency


Transparency makes shapes partly see through

- 1. Open Corel Draw and create a New Document
- 2. Change the settings as shown in the screenshot:
 - a. IMPORTANT: primary colour mode set to RGB
 - b. width 200mm
 - c. height 200mm
 - d. resolution 300dpi



Drawing circles

- 3. On the **left toolbar**, click the **Ellipse Tool**
- 4. **Hold down** the **CONTROL** and draw a circle. Aim to fill about a quarter of the canvas




- On the <u>right sidebar</u>, swap to the <u>Fill icon</u> and <u>fill</u> the circle with a suitable colour – I used a bright pink
- 6. On the <u>right sidebar</u>, swap back to the **Outline icon** (the pen) and make the stroke (the outline) **transparent** use the **colour drop down box** and choose the **square with the red line** through it at the **bottom** of the drop down




- 7. On the **left toolbar**, swap to the **Pick Tool** (the arrow at the top)
- 8. Click on the circle
- 9. At the **top**, click **Edit** > **Copy**
- 10. Then click Edit > Paste
- 11. **Drag** the circle to the right so that they overlap
- 12. Change the fill colour of the new circle I used an orange

Using transparency

- 13. Select one of the circles using the Pick Tool
- 14. On the <u>right sidebar</u>, switch to the <u>Transparency icon</u> (the checked one)
- 15. Choose the **Uniform Transparency** box
- 16. Change the **transparency** to about **40%** (experiment!)
- 17. Repeat with the other circle





A third circle

- 18. Copy and Paste one of the circles to make a third one
- 19. Change the **colour** I used green
- 20. Overlap the circles

Aligning the circles

Getting the circles aligned perfectly is tricky

- 21. Click on the first circle
- 22. Hold **SHIFT** down on the keyboard and **click** on the second circle
- 23. At the top, click Object > Align and Distribute > Align Centers Vertically This should line the top two circles up perfectly
- 24. It's harder to align the bottom circle. You need to do this by eye. Try using the arrow keys on the keyboard to nudge the shape
- 25. Click on the bottom circle
- 26. At the top, click Object > Order > To Back of Layer This sends the circle to the back, which changes the colours

Adding text

- 27. On the **left toolbar**, choose the **Text Tool** and add text to your logo
- 28. Highlight the text and format it using on the right sidebar. Uniform fill changes the colour; Outline colour puts a stroke around the edge
- 29. Use the **Pick Tool** to drag the text into position

Saving your work

- 30. At the top, click **File > Save As** and save your work using a sensible filename **BUT** this saves the work as a Corel Draw file. You can't use it anywhere else To use your work, you'll need to export it
- 31. Click **File** > **Export** (2/3rds of the way down)
- 32. From the **Save as type** drop down, choose **PNG** and export the file with a sensible name, Make sure that **transparency** is ticked
- 33. Now try exporting it as an **SVG** file a scalable vector graphic
