Working with shapes – gradient fill

Gradient fill is a different way to fill a shape

- Open Corel Draw and create a New Document

 primary colour mode RGB, width 200mm,
 height 200mm, resolution 300dpi
- 2. Draw a perfect circle (hold down **CONTROL**)
- 3. Make the outline thicker
- 4. Fill the circle with a solid colour

Fountain Fill

Using a gradient

- 5. On the <u>right sidebar</u>, make sure you're on the **Fill icon**
- Switch to Fountain fill
 The shape will probably change colour. Don't panic!
- 7. Find the **gradient line**. There are **two small arrow** icons on it, one at each end
- 8. **Click** on the arrow icon on the <u>left end</u> of the line
- 9. Underneath, use the **colour drop down** to change the colour I chose a bright blue
- 10. Now click on the **right hand** arrow icon
- Change the **colour** to a lighter shade of the same colour
- 12. Change the **opacity** to a suitable value I used 60%
- 13. Switch back to the **Outline icon** on the **right sidebar**
- 14. Make the outline transparent colour box and use the square with the red line through it at the bottom

- 16. Try adding a third gradient arrow
- 17. Don't forget to save your work and export it as a PNG file
