
# Working with shapes – an award badge


This will show you how to make shapes more complex

 Open Corel Draw and create a New Document – primary colour mode RGB, width 200mm, height 200mm, resolution 300dpi

# Drawing the circle

- Draw a perfect circle (hold down CONTROL)
   Don't make it too big. We need to add some shapes to it. Aim for just about 50% of the size of the canvas
- Align the circle to the centre: Object > Align and
   Distribute > Center to Page
- 4. **Fill** the circle with a solid colour. I used a light green
- 5. **HINT:** try using the Sliders option to get your colour right
- Change the outline to be white and 3mm thick
   This won't show up yet but is important later on to






# Add a rectangle


- 7. On the <u>left toolbar</u>, switch to the **Rectangle Tool** and draw a rectangle to be a bit wider than the circle

  Don't make it too wide
- 8. Change the **fill colour** to a darker shade of your fill colour
- 9. Make the **outline** transparent the square with the red line
- 10. Centre the rectangle on the page (see 4 above)

#### Add the ribbon

- 11. Switch to the **Pick Tool** on the **left toolbar**
- 12. Click on the rectangle and copy it: **Edit** > **Copy**
- 13. Edit > Paste
- Drag the rectangle down a bit and make it longer at each end
- 15. To get it perfectly in position, click Object > Align andDistribute > Center to Page Horizontally







# Adding anchor points to get the ribbon effect

This is the tricky bit


On the <u>left toolbar</u>, switch to the **Shape Tool** (second from top)




17. <u>Right click</u> on the second rectangle > choose Convert to Curves



18. Carefully <u>right click</u> half way up the **left edge** of the rectangle > choose **Add**This adds a new **anchor point** that can be dragged



19. With the **Shape Tool** still selected, **drag** the anchor point in to create the end of the ribbon



- 20. Repeat for the other end: add the anchor point first and then drag in
- 21. Move the top rectangle to the back: click Object > Order > To Back of Layer

If you made the outline of the circle white and 3mm thick this should give you a really nice ribbon effect

### Adding text

- 22. On the <u>left toolbar</u>, choose the **Text Tool** and add text to your logo
- 23. Highlight the text and format it using on the <u>right sidebar</u>.
  Uniform fill changes the colour; Outline colour puts a stroke around the edge



24. Use the **Pick Tool** to drag the text into position

#### Saving and exporting

25. Save your work and export it as a PNG. Add your work to your gallery of logos
