

# CD Cover – Black and White images

Turning an image black and white is easy. But there's more you can do than just black and white.

1. Open **Photoshop**
2. Open the image you want to edit: click **File > Open** and find the image
3. **Crop** the image first – use the crop tool and choose a **square crop** at the top

## **Basic Black & White**

4. At the top, click **Layer > New Adjustment Layer > choose Black and White > click OK**



This turns the image into a basic black and white image. It's OK, but it doesn't really have a huge impact.

## **Adding impact**

There are lots of different things ways you can make the image more dramatic and add some impact. They all add layers to the **Layer Stack** at the bottom right.


### **Brightness and Contrast – simple**

5. At the top click **Layers > New Adjustment Layer > Brightness/Contrast > OK**
6. Try sliding the **Contrast** slider to the right
7. Now try sliding the **Brightness** slider to the right as well
8. **Hide** the layer by clicking on the eye in the **Layer Stack** at the bottom right



### **Exposure – simple but effective**

9. At the top click **Layers > New Adjustment Layer > Exposure > OK**
10. Try sliding the **Exposure** slider to the right – but not too far!
11. Now try sliding the **Offset** slider to the left
12. **Hide** the layer by clicking on the eye in the **Layer Stack** at the bottom right




## ***Invert – simple***

13. At the top click **Layers > New Adjustment Layer > Invert > OK**  
You can't control Invert – although you can combine it with Exposure or Brightness/Contrast by turning those layers on again.
14. **Hide** the layer by clicking on the eye in the **Layer Stack** at the **bottom right**

## ***Finishing off***

15. Decide how you want your image to look. Turn on the layers you need in the **layer stack**  
Move any sliders around to get the style of image you're looking for



16. Now **add text** to your CD cover image

## ***Exporting the file for use***

Once you have a final image you need to save it

17. **Remove** any layers you're not using by deleting them – click on the layer and delete it using the bin at the **bottom right**
18. Click **File > Save As** and give the file a new name. Make sure you're saving your work in your **OneDrive**

**BUT:** this is a Photoshop file format. You can't actually use it for anything yet

To do that we need to export the file as a **JPG image**

19. Click **File > Export > Export As**
20. Change the **Format drop down box** at the **top right** to **JPG**
21. At the **bottom**, click **Export**
22. Give your file a **sensible name** and make sure you **know where you're saving it**
