CD Cover - multiple colours

This came from someone asking "how can I get the sky purple?"

- 1. Open **PhotoPaint** press **Alt** + **S** to get rid of the pop up
- 2. Click File > Open > find the image you want to use and open it
- 3. **IMPORTANT:** make sure you square crop your image first
- On the <u>right panel</u>, make sure you are clicked on **Objects** If you lose the right panel, click **Window** > **Dockers** > **Objects** to get it back

Step 1 – select the sky and split it off into a new layer


- On the <u>left toolbar</u>, find the Rectangle
 Mask Tool towards the <u>top</u>
- 6. <u>Click and hold</u> on the **Rectangle Mask** to pop up a set of tools that are hidden underneath
- 7. Choose the Magic Wand Mask Tool
 This is the tool that's easiest to use to select areas of an image




- 8. With the Magic Wand Mask Tool selected, click **once** somewhere on the sky This selects **part** of the sky you'll see an area of dashed lines ("**marching** ants")
- IMPORTANT: Hold SHIFT down on the keyboard and click on another part of the sky that's not selected.
 This adds to the area that's selected
- 10. **Keep adding** until all of the sky is selected
- 11. You can also hold CONTROL and click to remove any part that accidentally gets selected – this can be quite tricky to do. Be patient!
 - If it all goes wrong, click **Mask** > **Remove mask** and start over
- 12. Once all the sky is selected, click Object > Create > Copy from Mask
- 13. This splits the sky off into a new layer called something like **Object 1**. Look on the <u>right panel</u> to see that it's there, sitting **above** the Background layer

Step 2 – use hue and saturation

- 14. At the top, click Object > Create > New Lens
- 15. Choose **Hue/Saturation/Lightness** > **OK**
- 16. Use the **Hue** slider to change the colour
- 17. Then try turning the **Saturation** up a bit as well
- 18. Click **OK** when you're done
- 19. **IMPORTANT:** On the <u>right panel</u>, click on the **bottom layer** it should be called **Background**. When you're clicked on it you'll see it highlighted in blue
- 20. Now add a new **Hue/Saturation/Lightness** layer and change the **Hue** again This only changes the colour of the land section, not the sky
- 21. You might want to change the **Saturation** as well
- 22. Click OK
- 23. The layers should stack like in the screenshot



24. Use the **lens symbols** to the **left** of the layers to change the position of any sliders



Once you're done, make sure to save your work before adding text
