CD Cover – advanced selective colour

You need an image that you've picked out selective colours on to do this

- 1. Open **PhotoPaint** press **Alt** + **S** to get rid of the pop up
- 2. Click File > Open > find the image you want to use and open it
- On the <u>right panel</u>, make sure you're clicked on the <u>top</u> layer this should be the Grayscale layer
- 4. Object > Create > New Lens > Hue/Saturation/Lightness > OK
- 5. Change the **Hue**. This will make the image change colour
- 6. On the **left toolbar**, switch to the **Brush Tool**
- 7. At the **top**, change the size of the brush:
 - start by changing the brush
 type to Round 100 this brush
 has a hard edge that's
 what we want



- then at the **top**, change the size up to **200** to start with
- 8. At the **bottom** of the **left toolbar** is a colour selector. Make sure Black is on top
- On the Hue/Saturation layer, start painting over the top of part of the image. This will reveal the colour underneath again
 You can be quite basic here – you won't reveal too much
- 10. To correct mistakes, switch the brush colour to white use the double headed arrow at the <u>bottom</u> of the <u>left toolbar</u>
- 11. Now add a second
 Hue/Saturation/Lightness layer and
 repeat the process to get three colours
