

# CD Cover – advanced selective colour

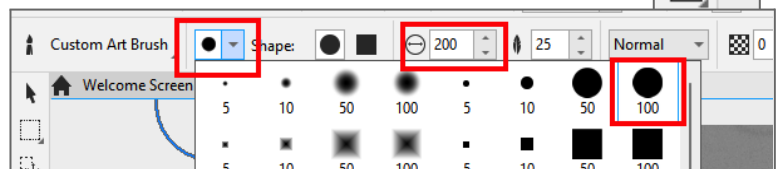
You need an image that you've picked out selective colours on to do this

1. Open **PhotoPaint** – press **Alt + S** to get rid of the pop up
2. Click **File > Open** > find the image you want to use and open it
3. On the **right panel**, make sure you're clicked on the **top** layer – this should be the Grayscale layer
4. **Object > Create > New Lens > Hue/Saturation/Lightness > OK**
5. Change the **Hue**. This will make the image change colour

6. On the **left toolbar**, switch to the **Brush Tool**

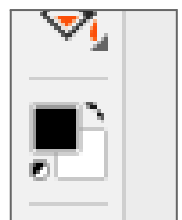
7. At the **top**, change the size of the brush:

- start by changing the **brush type** to **Round 100** – this brush has a **hard edge** – that's what we want



- then at the **top**, change the size up to **200** to start with

8. At the **bottom** of the **left toolbar** is a colour selector. Make sure Black is on top

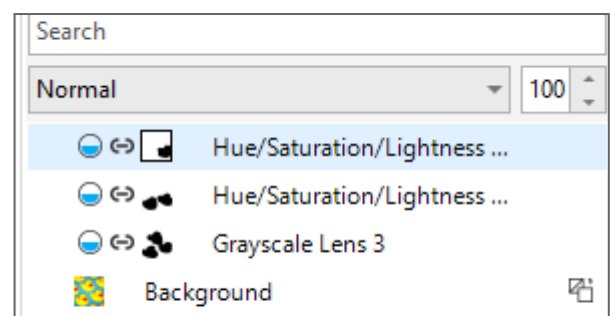


9. On the **Hue/Saturation layer**, start **painting** over the top of part of the image. This will **reveal** the colour underneath again

You can be quite basic here – you won't reveal too much

10. To correct mistakes, switch the **brush colour** to **white** – use the **double headed arrow** at the **bottom** of the **left toolbar**

11. Now add a **second Hue/Saturation/Lightness** layer and repeat the process to get three colours



Once you're done, make sure to **save your work** before **adding text**
