
IMPORTANT TO DO FIRST


Object > Create > From Background

This allows the background to become transparent by turning it into an object

Use the **Magic Wand Tool** – find it under the Rectangle Mask Tool at the top of the left toolbar



Change the **Tolerance** at the top



Wand picking up too much? Reduce the Tolerance


Wand not picking up enough? Increase the Tolerance


Use the **Brush Mask Tool** or **Magic Wand** to clean up

Hold down **SHIFT** to add to the selection


Hold down **CONTROL** to remove from the selection

Or switch to **Additive** (SHIFT) or **Subtractive** (CONTROL) mode at the top






For complex backgrounds, use the **Object Transparency Brush**



Copy the object in first, with the background

Opacity settings:

- 0 = remove all
- 255 = add back



Done?

Save as a **PNG** to keep the transparency – you want to **flatten** the image

Then you can **copy** the object to another image to combine it

Top tips:

- Don't forget to Object >
 Create > From
 Background
- Crop the image down as much as possible first
- Mask > Remove Mask to start the mask again
